Chairman's Report

Unfortunately we have had two resignations recently. Geoff Cummiskey, a valued member of the team who always conducted himself in a professional manner, resigned after being with us for over two years. Isobel Black resigned after nearly three years. However, she is now a co-opted member, helping mainly with safety and well-being matters.

We welcomed one new Community Councillor, Jim Melvin, who is proving to be a great asset - being very hands on and also engaging well with the community. We currently have two vacancies on the Community Council and would urge anyone interested to contact our Secretary for further information.

We very much appreciate all volunteers who give their time to help us. However, we are in need of more, especially for deliveries and events. Some events are in danger of not going ahead if we do not get more help. Another way to ensure the continuation of events would be for another group to take over the organization of an event, with the Community Council contributing financially. This would be an ideal opportunity for any interested group to fund raise. Regrettably, we will not be holding our regular car boot sales this year due to the shortage of community councillors and volunteers - perhaps another group could fill in for us! PROJECTS - we have been successful in winning East Lothian Council (ELC) funding for more planting of trees at the primary school. This will take place in the autumn and pupils will be involved in the project.

Funding has been secured from the **Safer East Lothian Fund** - supported by ELC - for the installation of a second speed reactive variable message sign to be erected at the east entrance.

Lighting for the Promenade - part of the funding has been won and it is hoped that, if successful in securing the rest, the lights will be in place by the late autumn. We have created an action plan for future projects. Watch our notice boards and local press for more information!

POLICING has increased greatly and the improvement in crime and anti-social behaviour statistics is evident.

However, speeding and noisy traffic, dog fouling and littering are still very much causes for concern along with vandalism and street crime. We are doing all we can to try to improve road safety and health and well-being issues that these types of anti-social behaviour cause. Penalties, fines and ASBO warnings are now being issued regularly by the police and wardens for traffic and dog fouling offences. We will be receiving news soon regarding the number of CCTV cameras and their locations. It is hoped that the cameras will be in place in October.

We welcome feedback on any matter. Please get in touch with us or come along to our public meetings where there is usually one or more Local Councillors and a Community Police Officer present.

Community Council Events

Senior Citizens New Year's Party - Best Ever!

Those who came along had a great afternoon. Having been served and entertained by volunteers they left with many complimentary remarks and told us that it had been the best ever! Unfortunately the numbers attending were way below usual. This was due to several factors i.e. being held so soon after the year and the reopening of the Centre, adverse weather conditions and ill health.

Achievement Awards 2009 - the Community Council is proud to hold these awards on Gala day after the Crowning of the Gala Queen. Seton Fields and Core Paths

The Seton Fields Community Company which represents our joint communities under the Community Right to Buy Scheme held its AGM on 23 April.

Seton Sands Holiday Village is still waiting for permission to go ahead fully with its plans for the west Field, and Gladedale Developments continue to own the east Field which is being managed at present by a tenant farmer.

The footpaths are gradually being re-established in both Fields and ELC's Core Paths Plan will ensure that the linking of Port Seton to Longniddry by footpath will have some permanent route across the Fields. The matter of the "ploughing-up" of paths has been handed over to ELC Countryside Dept, and it is hoped that they will advise against ploughing right to the field edges, and also prevent a reoccurrence of the destruction of the present routes through the Fields.

A198, Dual Carriageway and Fishers Road

Concern for road safety has been expressed at several Community Council meetings regarding the A198 road to Longniddry and also the dual-carriageway. With problems of a 70 mph limit on a sub-standard road, where stationary traffic, bicycles and other slow vehicles impede faster motorists, it is felt that a major accident will be inevitable unless something is done to improve the situation. The volume of traffic along this road has increased greatly as new houses are built further east.

The road junction into Port Seton from the A198 has seen many collisions and sadly, loss of life. The bends by the Farm Shop also pose difficulty for the unwary motorist. Speeding vehicles on Fishers Road, give pedestrians a difficult and dangerous time. Suggestions have been put forward that this could be a one-way system with entrance only from the south. Consultation and traffic surveys have already been carried but we intend to have further consultation with residents in these areas and more surveys done by ELC.

We would especially appreciate your feedback on this very important issue.

Library Report

The Library continues to play an important part within the community and provides free Internet access for all - including visitors to the area. We are still maintaining two readers groups and a writing group and adding support to the local History Society.

Our main aim for the forthcoming year is to increase our issue figures though there has been an increase in the usage of our PN (Public Network) PCs. We continue to provide an excellent service for all users, with staff actively promoting stock, and delivering a house-bound facility through our volunteer drivers to those who cannot manage to visit in person. Please contact us if you would like to make use of this service, or if you know of someone who might benefit.

We have recently had visits from P7 and P4 classes and look forward to having the P1 classes nearer the summer.

March saw the installment of a self-issue system. This should free up staff time to carry out other duties.

The winter months brought a few anti-social problems with groups of teenagers coming into the library and causing disruption. A conscientious level of service is maintained by the staff - however we would like to remind parents that we cannot guarantee that unsupervised children are not subjected to this unsuitable behaviour. There is also the legal issue of children under eight being unaccompanied - we notice this has been increasing. Children under 8 should always be in the care of someone aged 16 or over.

A small group of adult library users, aptly called "Let's Think", has started meeting monthly to discuss philosophical issues. It is hoped that as a result of these meetings a young persons' version will eventually be established.

Over the months we have had good use of our (limited) display case and boards, with locally produced crafts on show. There have also been several enjoyable author visits and talks.

NEWS FROM PORT SETON CENTRE

Following our successful **'Life After Work' Retirement Event** which attracted over 120 people, we aim to strengthen links with existing community groups to help them continue to provide valuable local services. We want to encourage more people who are retired to take part in activities in their community.

Adult Literacy Development Worker, Blathnaid Quinn, aims to run another group to help parents support their children with literacy/numeracy skills. She will be on placement with the Centre two days a week and aims to get involved in work on the mural project with the Outdoor Classroom, young people and the John Bellany Day Centre.

Youth Work - we are delighted with the number of young people who come for a range of activities each week including youth clubs and dance classes. On Monday night we have the junior youth club from 6.30pm. On Tuesday from 7.15pm we operate a senior 'Drop In' and on Wednesday our Youth Gym offers two coached sessions for girls and boys. We secured a grant to help keep the Youth Gym going and have purchased a new punch bag and will be working with young people to develop this facility. On Friday afternoons many young people use the library and a youth worker is on hand to offer support and assist library staff. We also offer a monthly Friday junior disco.

The **'Guid Cause' Big Coffee Morning** marked the centenary celebrations and people learned more about the women's suffragette movement as part of International Women's Day. We will run another Coffee Morning on Saturday 5 September to bring together all those who wish to take part in the commemorative march on October 10. We hope to have a big turn out of women from East Lothian to re-enact this memorable event and pay tribute to the struggle of women in Scotland to obtain their vote.

Healthy Eating in the Café - working in partnership with the Resource Centre we have now completed an application for the Healthy Living Award. We invited Roots & Fruits (a community food initiative) to come along with fresh fruit and vegetables and people gave their views on what healthy options they would like to see. The café is the hub of the Centre and we aim to build on its success!

Port Seton Centre Advisory Committee - our Annual Report will be available at the Port Seton Centre Advisory Group AGM on **Wednesday 13 May 2009 at 7pm**. All the groups which meet in the Centre on a regular basis will be encouraged to send a representative to the meeting. The continued commitment from the members is appreciated and valued but we need more people onboard. It is people who make the difference and with your help the Centre can grow from strength to strength. 3 Harbours Festival Events at the Centre: The 197 Collective & Friends - after their successful exhibition in the summer of 2008 'The 197 Collective' (their work being part of the 'Accessible Arts' exhibition, 'Therapy in Art' at the Brunton Theatre) return in 2009 with new work alongside some of the pieces from the original exhibition. The collective group of artists from Port Seton Resource Centre, Tynebank Resource Centre, Mansfield Road Resource Centre and Cockenzie Primary School will display their work within Port Seton Resource Centre. 2009 has also seen other individuals linking up with the collective. Artists from organisations 'Headway East Lothian' and 'Stepping Out' will also be exhibiting alongside work by Gemma Coyle, John Murphy and Sarah Forshaw. The exhibition will open on **Saturday 6 June at 2pm** at the Resource Centre within the Centre.

Destroy Rock and Roll' - to take place on Friday 12 June 2009 - a night of music performed by local bands from the Red School based in Prestonpans. It's your chance to see 'The Re-Insurers', 'Unplugged', 'Nuckie', and 'Oddity' all play at the same venue on the same night!

Cockenzie and Port Seton Children's Gala Day - Sat 6 June 2009

John Bellany Day Centre

This in fact is the grant money we receive **each year** from ELC to go towards staffing, transport and other running costs. It always falls short of our needs and we have to fund raise to meet the shortfall. The misleading press report will, I feel, jeopardise our cause. If it were not for the generosity of the local community we would not be able to function at the level we do. We are the only Day Centre in East Lothian that operates six days. Our staff are fully qualified and highly motivated. I hope that we can still rely on the community to support us.

There is a fundraiser being held in aid of John Bellany Day Centre in May at Royal Musselburgh. There will be a raffle and an auction and we have to provide items for these. Home-Start East Lothian

Home-Start East Lothian is part of the biggest family support organisation in the UK. This local scheme is run by a Board of Trustees and Advisors and employs two Co-ordinators and two administration staff. The Co-ordinators recruit volunteers to befriend and support parents with pre-school children who may be experiencing difficulties.

Every week Volunteer Befrienders visit a family they are matched to and offer practical help and emotional support. Families may be experiencing difficulties due to a large number of children under five; twins; post natal illness; depression; disability; isolation or other issues. We ask volunteers to commit for about two years as we may well support a family for that length of time. Families enjoy having the company of another parent or person with experience of working with children. The weekly visit can help raise self esteem and confidence which benefits the family. Families sometimes become volunteers themselves when the time is right for them!

Volunteers get an enormous amount out of belonging to Home-Start East Lothian! *You* will gain worthwhile experience, feel a sense of purpose, be valued as part of a team, receive expenses, regular support, supervision and ongoing training. *You* will have fun with a family and enjoy the social element of Home-Start as well.
